




Life Expectancy 1900, 2013






The Cost of a Long Life








Leading Cause of Death In Virginia By Percentage of All Deaths 2013




Years of Potential Life Lost (YPLL) Before Age 65

2013 Virginia All Races, Both Sexes All Deaths




Colorectal Cancer – Localized Stage Map, VA 2012






Chronic Disease Prevalence In Virginia For Those Aged 65+





Prevalence, Number of Deaths, and Hospitalization Costs of Chronic Diseases, 2013











Current Smoking Rates by Health District - 2014

Health Impact Assessment (HIA)



A systematic process that uses an array of data sources and analytic methods and considers input from stakeholders to determine the potential effects of a proposed policy, plan, program, or project on the health of a population and the distribution of those effects within the population. HIA provides recommendations on monitoring and managing those effects.
