WHY A NEED FOR EQUITABLE COLLABORATION?

- IN SITUATIONS INVOLVING HIGH STAKES AND CONFLICT, ORDINARY PUBLIC PROCESSES MAY PERPETUATE LONG-STANDING HARMFUL STRUCTURAL AND PERSONAL POWER IMBALANCES.
- PEOPLE ONLY GAIN REAL SATISFACTION AND JUST AS IMPORTANTLY, WILL BE BEST PREPARED TO WORK

 TOGETHER WHEN BEING HEARD AND UNDERSTOOD, ENGAGING IN A FAIR AND EQUITABLE PROCESS, AND

 HELPING TO CRAFT THE OUTCOMES THAT IMPACT THEM.

INSTITUTIONS AND COMMUNITIES WILL PRODUCE MORE DURABLE AND MORE SATISFYING OUTCOMES IF THEY ADOPT PRINCIPLES OF "EQUITABLE COLLABORATION" TO GUIDE THEIR DECISION-MAKING PROCESSES.

 WILL WORK BEST TO MEET YOUR GOALS

- May Meet Minimal Legal Requirements



NOT USEFUL FOR LEARNING, BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS, AND CONSENSUS BUILDING

FITTING THE PROCESS TO THE NEED: COMMUNITY DIALOGUES

- SEEK TO DEVELOP IMPROVED UNDERSTANDING
- TYPICALLY FACILITATED BY IMPARTIAL FACILITATOR
- STRUCTURED RULES FOR SPEAKING TO EQUALIZE CONTRIBUTION.



• NOT INTENDED TO LEAD TO DECISIONS AND ACTIONS











Concept Diagram



A grove of trees will envelop the Freedom Ring, suggesting "brush arbors" or "hush harbors"—the sheltered clearings in the woods where slaves gathered for worship and for escape. Within the concentric rings of the granite memorial will be a grassy circle for gatherings.











EQUITABLE COLLABORATION KEY ELEMENTS

- TRAUMA-INFORMED ENGAGEMENT ACKNOWLEDGES
 THAT CONFLICT MAY EVOKE HARMFUL EMOTIONS IN
 INDIVIDUALS AND GROUPS. PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT MAY
 PROVOKE ADDITIONAL TRAUMA, UNLESS THERE IS CAREFUL
 ATTENTION TO PROCESS DESIGN.
- WHAT TRAUMAS ARE THERE ASSOCIATED WITH PARTICULAR ISSUES OR PLACES? ARE THERE ISSUES THAT MAY EVOKE TRAUMA? HOW MAY WE UNDERTAKE PREPARATIONS AND ACTIONS THAT PREVENT, MINIMIZE, OR PREPARE AND SUPPORT PEOPLE FOR RENEWED TRAUMA?

- How may we foster Cultural Humility?







EQUITABLE COLLABORATION TRUTH-SEEKING

- Intense Conflicts Invariably Involve
 Competing Truth Claims
- How May We Invite Honest, More Complete Knowledge?
- EVEN WHEN ESPECIALLY WHEN SUCH KNOWLEDGE MAY BE PAINFUL TO HEAR AND UNDERSTAND?




How does it continue to impact you today?

Memories, stories, narratives

Who decided, who benefitted, who lost, what did they lose?

- PELIBERATIVE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT THAT BEGINS BY INVITING PEOPLE TO PICK FROM ONE OR TWO OPTIONS POLARIZES. EQUITABLE COLLABORATION BEGINS WITH THE PREMISE THAT PEOPLE CAN AND WILL LEARN FROM ONE ANOTHER. IT FULLY EXPLORES ISSUES BEFORE SEEKING SOLUTIONS.
- IT FOSTERS <u>BRAVE SPACES</u> PLACES WHERE PARTICIPANTS HONESTLY AND OPENLY CONFRONT THEIR PAST AND PRESENT, KNOWING THAT A BETTER FUTURE DEPENDS UPON SUCH ENGAGEMENT.
- IT FOSTERS REAL SHARED CIVIC THINKING, NOT BY A FALSE CIVILITY THAT PRIVILEGES ORDER OVER CANDOR BUT BY ACKNOWLEDGMENT THAT WE ALL CAN LEARN AND GROW, AND NEED TO DO SO TOGETHER.

- "OPEN HOUSE" (INFORMAL GATHERING) TO ALLOW AND ENCOURAGE INDIVIDUAL CONVERSATIONS
- IDEA BOARDS (ALLOWING COMMENT AND IDEAS)
- EMAIL COMMENTS




EQUITABLE COLLABORATION DELIBERATIVE

- EFFECTUAL PUBLIC DELIBERATION
 BEGINS WITH THE PREMISE THAT
 PEOPLE CAN AND WILL LEARN
 FROM ONE ANOTHER
 - FULLY EXPLORES ISSUES BEFORE SEEKING SOLUTIONS

- FOSTERS BRAVE SPACES WHERE PARTICIPANTS HONESTLY
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- FOSTERS REAL SHARED CIVIC THINKING NOT BY A FALSE
 CIVILITY THAT PRIVILEGES ORDER OVER CANDOR BUT BY
 ACKNOWLEDGMENT THAT WE ALL CAN LEARN AND GROW,
 AND NEED TO DO SO TOGETHER

- PROCESS FOR THE SITUATION IS NOT ONLY A QUESTION OF EFFECTIVENESS; IT IS A WAY OF RESPECTING PEOPLE'S TIME.
- HOW MAY WE MAKE WISE USE OF PARTICIPANTS' TIME?
- How may we ensure that we have an effective process?



EQUITABLE COLLABORATION EFFECTUAL


