# Additional Funding Requests for STBG & CRP

The Roanoke Valley Transportation
Planning Organization will consider
additional funding requests for current
Surface Transportation Block Grant

(STBG) and Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) projects.

As part of this process, project sponsors will provide updates on the status of their existing projects. The RVTPO Transportation Technical Committee will evaluate these projects and develop a recommendation to the RVTPO Policy Board on requests for additional funding. The STBG and CRP funding programs support a variety of local projects, including greenways, roadways, pedestrian and bicycle accommodations, and safety improvements. ### Safe Streets for All

Roanoke County, Botetourt County and the Town of Vinton are collaborating on a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan through the Federal Highway Administration's Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program with the goal of preventing deaths and serious injuries for all

roadway users, including pedestrians, bicyclists, motorists, commercial vehicle operators, transit riders, and micromobility users.
